- 4. **Check for Typos and Inconsistent Information:** Pay close attention to the details in job listings, emails, and communications. Spelling and grammatical errors, as well as inconsistencies in job descriptions, can be indicators of a scam.
- 5. **Do Not Share Personal or Financial Information:** Never provide sensitive information like your Social Insurance Number, bank account details, credit card information or a copy of your passport or driver's license.
- 6. **Trust Your Instincts:** If something feels off or too good to be true, it probably is. Trust your intuition and proceed with caution.
