

Dual Credit Cross Enrollment Between School Boards

For ONSIS, students stay in the original board.

Students must remain attached to their home school board and not the board in which they are taking the single course.

Students must register in the school that the single course will be in as well as register on earn dual credits.ca.

The home school board must provide a contact teacher and administrator in the case of an escalated issue. The teacher in the single course will be their full teacher for the class. If issues require escalation, the teacher of the single course must notify their administrator of their own school as well as the teacher and administrator of the students from the home school board.

For SCWI benchmark funding, the school that the course is offered in gets the benchmark funding.

Data reporting - the teacher at the home school must complete the data reporting and provide that information to the teacher of the single course. This is for the cross enrolled students only. The teacher of the single course would be responsible for everyone else's data for data reporting.

If transportation is required, the home school board must communicate detailed breakdowns of what transportation is required so that the school board offering the course can apply for any additional transportation funding required. The home school board would invoice the school board that is offering the course for the transportation cost. This is on the condition that the transportation is approved. If additional transportation is not approved, then the home school board would need to cover their own transportation costs.

When transcripts are sent out to the board/contact with the school board of the course, and of the cross enrolled students would need to be shared to the admin of the home board.
