RENEWAL TO THE 2013 AGREEMENT

JULY 2017

The PARTIES to this ARTICULATION AGREEMENT are **Sir Sandford Fleming College of Applied Arts and Technology** (hereinafter referred to as "**FLEMING**"), whose address is 599 Brealey Drive, Peterborough, Ontario, K9J 7B1, Canada and **LAKE SUPERIOR STATE UNIVERSITY** (hereinafter referred to as "**LSSU**"), whose address is 650 W Easterday Avenue, Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, 49783, USA.

This AGREEMENT establishes the principles, guidelines, and procedures governing admission and assessment of selected qualified students to enter the BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE – CRIMINAL JUSTICE GENERALIST program at LSSU, subsequent to the successful completion of the Community & Justice Services, Protection, Security & Investigation, or Police Foundations programs at FLEMING.

This AGREEMENT replaces all previous agreement versions.

ARTICLE 1: DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this AGREEMENT:

- "**AGREEMENT**" shall mean this articulation agreement, and any or all of its attached Schedules and Appendices and additional documents incorporated by reference
- "**PARTIES**" shall refer to both Sir Sandford Fleming College of Applied Arts and Technology and Lake Superior State University

ARTICLE 2: RECRUITMENT AND MARKETING

Recruitment and marketing representatives, appropriate faculty and program coordinators or designates at both PARTIES will be responsible for promoting the pathway and recruiting students.

ARTICLE 3: STUDENTS

Through communication with LSSU, program faculty students will be advised to consult with their program coordinator or designate to ensure they are on track to successfully complete their program of study. LSSU program faculty will support incoming students by providing them with relevant information related to their program.

LSSU recognizes and accepts the importance of giving advance notice to students of the possible full-cost of completing program of study.

ARTICLE 4: UPDATES

Dean or designate and their respective department(s) will be responsible for coordinating collaborative meetings to coordinate and update this AGREEMENT. Frequency of meetings is to be determined.

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ARTICLE 5: TRANSFER CREDIT

LSSU will be responsible for ensuring that eligible students be enrolled into the appropriate academic semester. Reference the appropriate Schedule for details.

ARTICLE 6: PROGRAM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Credential requirements are subject to change at any time and the LSSU Academic Calendar should be consulted prior to enrolling in course(s) to ensure credential requirements are being met.

ARTICLE 7: DATA SHARING

In order to determine the success of the AGREEMENT, LSSU and FLEMING will follow the progress of participating students. Both PARTIES will provide each other with regular (frequency to be determined) progress reports concerning the participants. Progress reports shall adhere to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, RSO. 1990, c. F.31 (Ontario).

ARTICLE 8: IMPLEMENTATION AND REVIEW

This AGREEMENT is subject to review whenever either Party makes curricular changes that affect the AGREEMENT. When a change occurs, the program departments will notify their respective articulation designates so that the AGREEMENT can be updated.

This AGREEMENT will be valid from August 2017 to August 2020.

ARTICLE 9: MARKS, LOGOS, AND NAMES

The PARTIES shall seek permission from the other before using the other's name, trademark, logo, or other associated mark in any promotional material. Upon the expiration or termination of this agreement, the PARTIES shall forthwith at their own cost and expense, discontinue the display of the other's Marks.

ARTICLE 10: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

Both PARTIES acknowledge that the other is an educational institution, to which is subject to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, RSO. 1990, c. F.31 (Ontario). To extend that LSSU or its Representatives receive any Personal Information concerning Fleming's faculty, students, staff they shall

- i. not disclose such information to any third party without prior written consent from FLEMING;
- ii. disclose such information only to its Representatives who require it to discharge their duties and functions; and
- iii. be responsible to FLEMING for any breach for this provision by it or its Representatives.

Each Party agrees to maintain in confidence and safeguard all CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION of the other Party as well as any Personal Information disclosed to it by the other Party. More specifically, each Party agrees to:

- i. use the CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION only for the purpose of fulfilling the intent of this AGREEMENT;
- ii. use the same degree of care as with its own CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION, which shall be at least a reasonable standard of care, to prevent disclosure of the CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION;
- iii. disclose CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION only to its employees, directors, officers, students, agents, and contractors ("Representatives") who have a "need to know" and who shall be made aware of, and be required to observe and comply with the covenants and obligations contained herein;
- iv. assume all liability for any breach of this AGREEMENT by it or its Representatives; and
- v. treat Personal Information as required by Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, RSO. 1990, c. F.31 (Ontario).

Notwithstanding any other provision of this AGREEMENT, each Party acknowledges that the obligations of ARTICLE 10 (CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION) herein shall not apply to information that is:

- i. available to the public at the time of disclosure, or subsequent becomes available to the public without fault of Recipient;
- ii. was publicly available at the time it was transmitted to the receiving party
- iii. is required to be disclosed by law or by any other governmental agency

The PARTIES agree that any violation of this confidentiality will result in irreparable damage to the other.

ARTICLE 11: TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

LSSU does not guarantee admission or placement into any program as outlined in the Schedules. The existence of a program description in any promotional material does not constitute a legal undertaking that the program will be available.

Either PARTY may terminate this AGREEMENT. In this case, notice of six months is required and the termination request should be submitted in writing. In the event of termination of the AGREEMENT, every effort will be made to ensure that students currently enrolled in the program will not be affected.

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ARTICLE 12: INDEMNIFICATION AND LIABILITY

FLEMING agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless LSSU (including its Representatives) from and against all claims, actions, liabilities, costs, damages, losses and expenses arising from the breach of FLEMING's obligations under this AGREEMENT or as the result of any negligent act or omission or wilful misconduct of FLEMING, or its Representatives, with respect to this AGREEMENT and the subject matter hereof.

LSSU agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless FLEMING (including its Representatives) from and against all claims, actions, liabilities, costs, damages, losses and expenses arising from the breach of LSSU's obligations under this AGREEMENT or as the result of any negligent act or omission or wilful misconduct of LSSU, or its Representatives, with respect to this AGREEMENT and the subject matter hereof.

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




