

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

Faculty of Forestry & Environmental Management, University of New Brunswick

Brunswick

and

Fleming College, Forestry Technician Diploma

This Memorandum of Understanding constitutes an agreement between the Faculty of Forestry & Environmental Management, University of New Brunswick (ForEM) and Fleming College.

Objective of the Agreement

Graduates of the Forestry Technician Diploma program at Fleming College who meet the admission requirements into ForEM's Bachelor of Science in Forestry (BScF) will be eligible for direct credit transfer up to 49 credit hours. Eligible transferable courses (listed in the attachment) require a grade of 70% or greater. Exceptions to this rule are given in the attachment.

As a partner to this agreement, Fleming College agrees to:

- make information about this agreement available to students enrolled in the Forestry Technician Diploma program
- notify ForEM about any changes to program curricula which may impact transferability
- provide opportunity for representatives of ForEM to visit appropriate forums at Fleming College to disseminate information about the BScF program.

As a partner to this agreement, ForEM agrees to:

- notify Fleming College about any changes to the BScF program curricula which may impact transferability
- provide opportunity for representatives of Fleming College to visit appropriate forums at ForEM


Liaison

Implementation of this agreement will be through the Office of the Registrar at each institution, in consultation with the appropriate authorities in the respective programs.

Terms of the Agreement


This agreement shall be in place for an initial period of five years, commencing Jul 1, 2009. At the end of this time, the agreement may be extended for an additional period of time subject to the review and approval of the participating organizations. This agreement shall remain in effect unless terminated earlier by either party. Normally at least one (1) year in advance a written notice will be provided. In any event, termination shall be without penalty and neither party will be liable to the other for any monetary or other losses that may result.
