

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
SIR SANDFORD FLEMING COLLEGE  
AND  
TRILLIUM LAKELANDS DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD  
Effective September 2007**

This document sets forth the understanding between the School of Environmental and Natural Resource Sciences (SENRS) at Sir Sandford Fleming College (Fleming College) and the Trillium Lakelands District School Board with respect to the examination and crediting of the curriculum in the "Making Environmental Connections" (6 credit) enriched program currently offered at I.E. Weldon Secondary School, and Lindsay Collegiate & Vocational Institute.

The curriculum assessment has been completed by SENRS faculty and the outcome of this process is the establishment of an articulation agreement between Fleming College and Trillium Lakelands DSB that outlines the conditions under which specific secondary school students may take advantage of this opportunity.

Students who successfully complete the enriched "Making Environmental Connections" Program (average grade of 70% across the six credit program) and have completed their OSSD with the courses identified below will be awarded exemption from all common first semester courses at the SENRS, and will be eligible to enter directly into semester two of the programs listed in Appendix A.

Required OSSD courses:

SBI3C	Biology
CGF3M	Physical Geography
ENG4C	English
MAP4C	Mathematics

Plus two (2) Co-operative Education Credits  
(Taken on-site at the Frost Campus in Lindsay, Ontario)  
See Appendix A for further details

This agreement also includes the following elements:

- Adherence to the normal admissions process to specific SENRS programs, with entrance based on availability of seats in second semester.
- Provision for an advising model for the students participating in the articulation activity.
- This articulation agreement will be reviewed annually, with first date of review to be May 2008.
  
- A committee including representatives from Trillium Lakelands DSB, (Sonja Vandermeer, Bruce Barrett, Randy Stringer) and Fleming College, SENRS (Barb Elliott, Linda Skilton, Trudy Heffernan) have contributed to the definition of the terms of this articulation agreement and will be responsible for ongoing communications as well as annual review.

Both parties by signing this document are indicating their agreement and acceptance of the foregoing.

## **APPENDIX A**

### **Additional Information re: 'Making Environmental Connections' Enriched Program**

#### Co-operative Education:

The co-op education portion of this program will take place at the Frost Campus in Lindsay and will allow the students to meet specific requirements of various semester one college courses. During their co-operative education learning experiences, students will:

- a. participate in specific field and lab based activities with Fleming students
- b. participate in real world work experiences with their mentors.

#### Initial Intake:

In order to ensure the success of the students in this program, the initial pilot for 2007/08 will include a limit of 5 student spaces available for this co-operative education experience.

1. Ecosystem Management Technician/Technology
2. Environmental Technician/Technology
3. Fish & Wildlife Technician/Technology
4. Forestry Technician
5. Geological Technician
6. Park Operations & Outdoor Recreation Technician
7. Drilling & Blasting Technician
8. Geomatics Technician
