# Transfer Credit Pathway Between Carleton University Bachelor of Arts (Criminology) and Fleming College Two Year Diploma in Police Foundations

WHEREAS both parties wish to tighten the bonds which link them so as to promote and foster collaboration in program delivery;

WHEREAS both parties intend to collaborate in order to facilitate access to the University for College graduates;

WHEREAS the College offers an Ontario College Diploma program in *Police Foundations* and that students having completed this program are well-suited to meet the requirements of the University's *Bachelor of Arts (Criminology)* program;

BEARING IN MIND the previously stated mutual commitments, the parties agree as follows:

- The University will award students, having completed the *two-year* diploma in *Police Foundations, 5.0* transfer credits to be applied to the related University *Bachelor of Arts (Criminology)* degree. For the purpose of this pathway, successful completion will mean completion of the above-mentioned program with an average of *3.3* (on a 4.0 scale) or equivalent to a minimum of B+ (77%) average.
- 2. The advanced standing has been determined by the *Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences and the Faculty of Public Affairs*. The transfer credits to be awarded are outlined in Appendix A for students who have completed the *Police Foundations* program.
- 3. The University agrees that there will be no restriction on the number of qualified applicants from the College accepted into the University degree program provided that the program is open for admissions.
- 4. The College will keep the University informed of any changes in the content of courses serving as the basis for advanced standing and assist the University in any review of said courses.
- 5. Either party will consult with the other before making any curriculum changes to the abovementioned programs. Amendments to this protocol may be made upon mutual agreement, with the understanding that any unapproved change could lead to the termination of this pathway.
- 6. Paragraph 5 notwithstanding, the pathway may be terminated by either party by written notification with six months' notice.
- 7. This pathway will be in effect from the date of signing for the duration of three years and may be renewed upon mutual agreement.

- 8. Both the University and College agree to promote this pathway in their respective publications.
- 9. As required by the Carleton University Calendar, each application will be evaluated on a case by case basis.
