This agreement establishes the principles, guidelines, and procedures governing admission and assessment of selected qualified students to enter Trent University on an advanced standing basis, subsequent to the successful completion of Fleming College's Social Service Worker two-year diploma program.

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1. The purpose of this agreement is to provide qualified graduates of Fleming College's Ontario College Social Service Worker program with a seamless option for continuing their education at Trent University in the Bachelor of Social Work Program at Trent University. It is important to note that entry into third year of the Bachelor of Social Work Program includes an additional application process. Admission to the Professional Years is very competitive. Students who are not accepted into third year will need to choose another major, continue their studies at Trent and will have access to Academic Advisors for assistance.

2. ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

2.1. Student Supports

Trent's program faculty will support incoming students by providing them with relevant information related to their program, particularly the admission process for year 3 of the program.

2.2. Admissions

The Admissions Office at Trent University will be responsible for ensuring that eligible students will be awarded credit transfers as stated in said agreement.

2.3. Recruitment and Marketing

Recruitment and marketing representatives at Trent University will be responsible for promoting the articulation pathway, recruiting students, and providing the necessary orientation as students move from one institution to the other.

2.4. Students

Through communication with program faculty and orientation sessions, students will be advised to consult academic advisors to ensure they are successfully completing program requirements, particularly the requirements to apply for year 3 of the program.

3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

- 3.1. Graduates of Fleming’s Ontario College Social Service Worker Diploma program will be granted 6.0 credits towards a four-year Bachelor of Social Work Degree at Trent University.
- 3.2. This agreement accepts students into year two of the Bachelor of Social Work Program. Students are required to apply for entry into year three of program in order to continue with the professional years of the Bachelor of Social Work Program. Students, who are not accepted, will be able to choose an alternative major to continue with their university studies. The transfer credits awarded to a student through this agreement will remain with the student in their alternate program of study. Students, who are not accepted, will be able to complete either a general or honours degree at Trent University in an alternate program. This is subject to specific program regulation.
- 3.3. See appendix 1.0 for transfer credits assigned for graduates of the Ontario College Social Service Worker Diploma program at Fleming College prior to the installation of the agreement granting entrance to students beginning in Fall 2016 under the terms of the articulation.

4. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 To qualify for this agreement, students must have:
- Successfully completed Fleming College’s Ontario College Social Service Worker Diploma program;
 - A minimum overall average of 75%.
- 4.2. Students must meet all specific admission and enrollment standards and requirements for the program and will be accepted subject to capacity if applicable.

5. TRANSFER OF CREDITS

- 5.1. Students who are eligible, graduating from the Ontario College Social Service Worker Diploma program at Fleming College with a minimum average of 75%, will be granted 6.0 credits towards the successful completion of a 20 credit Bachelor of Social Work Degree.

As these credits recognize areas covered in Fleming College’s Ontario College Social Service Worker Diploma program rather than one-to-one course equivalents, numerical grades will not be recorded on the Trent transcript. Completion of these credits will be recognized with a pass grade.

6. PROGRAM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 6.1. Upon admission to the generalist Bachelor of Social Work Program, students must satisfy all general education, graduation, and major requirements as outlined in the University’s undergraduate calendar. If a student does not have the foundation or skills to enroll in an upper level course because of a lack of the appropriate introductory course(s), the necessary prerequisite course(s) will be required.
- 6.2. If a student transfers to a different degree program it is the student’s responsibility to consult with an academic advisor and to notify the Registrar’s Office of any program changes.
- 6.3. To satisfy the requirements to apply to the Professional Years of Trent’s Bachelor of Social Work Program, students will need to complete specific courses to meet program requirements in addition to the courses they have already been granted from Fleming College.

- 6.4. Students from Fleming College are granted 6.0 transfer credits upon admission and are required to take an additional 5.0 credits to meet specific program requirements in order to apply for the third year of the Bachelor of Social Work Program. Students must follow the third year application process as determined by the Social Work department. Once students are accepted into the Professional Years of the program, they will need to complete an additional 9.0 credits to fulfill Departmental degree requirements.

- 6.5. Students are granted course equivalency of the third year placement, Social Work Field Education Placement One (SWRK 3000Y), upon admission to Trent University from Fleming College. If a student is not accepted into the Professional Years this credit will count towards general degree requirements in a different major.
- 6.6. Students applying to the professional years of the Bachelor of Social Work will be evaluated on their Trent academic performance only as all credits transferred are placed on academic record are granted as pass/fail.
- 6.7. It is recommended that students transferring to Trent University consult with a Trent academic advisor prior to beginning their studies at Trent as degree planning may require completion of summer courses for on time baccalaureate achievement should students need to declare an alternate major.

7. IMPLEMENTATION AND REVIEW


This agreement is subject to review when curricular changes may have an impact on the agreement. When a change occurs, the program department will notify their respective articulation designates so that the agreement can be updated. Articulation designates will review the agreement annually to ensure it is current. This Agreement may be terminated with notice of one year. In the event of termination of the Agreement, every effort will be made to ensure that students currently enrolled in the program will not be affected.
