## MAY 2022 ADDENDUM TO THE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT #5650 BETWEEN FLEMING COLLEGE'S PROTECTION, SECURITY AND INVESTIGATION DIPLOMA AND TRENT UNIVERSITY'S BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS), POLICING AND COMMUNITY WELL-BEING

This Addendum recognizes the changes outlined below, which shall become effective as of the Spring 2024 intake at Trent University. These changes will remain effective until the above-mentioned Agreement expires or until a new agreement is entered into, whichever occurs first.
