- A minimum overall average of 75%.

1.2. Students must meet all specific admission and enrollment standards, and requirements for the selected program. Students will be accepted subject to capacity, if applicable.


4. IMPLEMENTATION AND REVIEW

TRANSFER CREDIT POLICY #10112
FOR GRADUATES OF
THE SIR SANDFORD FLEMING COLLEGE OF APPLIED ARTS AND TECHNOLOGY'S
ONTARIO COLLEGE DIPLOMA IN DEVELOPMENTAL SERVICES WORKER

This update recognizes the changes outlined below, which shall become effective immediately at Trent University. These changes will remain effective until the above-mentioned Agreement expires or until a new agreement is entered into, whichever occurs first.

The following changes have occurred:

- Clarifying transfer credit eligibility for students who have completed the Indigenous Perspectives Designation.

Changes refer to Section 2 of the Policy. The following will be added as Article 2.3:

- Students who have completed the Indigenous Perspectives Designation (IPD) and who meet the terms of this articulation agreement are eligible to receive an additional transfer credit.
- Students will receive credit for INDG 1002H: Foundations of Modern Indigenous Life for completing INDG 128: Introduction to Indigenous Knowledges.
- Completion of INDG 49: Introduction to Indigenous Studies is already recognized as part of the original transfer credit block, providing INDG 1001H: The Foundation for Reconciliation as transfer credit.
