This Addendum recognizes the changes outlined below, which shall become effective as of the Fall 2024 intake at Fleming College. These changes will remain effective until the above-mentioned Agreement expires or until a new agreement is entered in to, whichever occurs first.

The following changes to the Agreement have occurred:

- Updated transfer credit block to reflect curriculum changes in the Paralegal Diploma program;
- Updated degree requirement chart to reflect the new transfer credit block.

These changes specifically refer to Sections 5 and 6 of the Agreement.
