## DECEMBER 2024 ADDENDUM TO THE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT #10122 BETWEEN THE SIR SANDFORD FLEMING COLLEGE'S ONTARIO COLLEGE DIPLOMA IN COMMUNITY AND JUSTICE SERVICES AND TRENT UNIVERSITY'S BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS), CRIMINOLOGY

This Addendum recognizes the changes outlined below, which became effective as of the Fall 2024 intake at Fleming College. These changes will remain effective until the above-mentioned Agreement expires or until a new agreement is entered in to, whichever occurs first.

The following changes to the Agreement have occurred:

- Updated transfer credit block to reflect curriculum changes in the Community and Justice Services Diploma, including:
  - Replacement of COMM 201 Communications I (45 hours) with COMM 255 Communications I for Law and Justice Professionals (45 hours);
  - Removal of LAWS 43 Introduction to Political Science and Public Administration (45 hours);
  - Removal of GNED 154 The Diversity Lens (45 hours).
- Updated degree requirement chart to reflect the new transfer credit block.

These changes specifically refer to Sections 5 and 6 of the Agreement.

## **BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS), CRIMINOLOGY: TRANSFER CREDITS**
