BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS), POLITICAL STUDIES: TRANSFER CREDITS

Students graduating from Fleming College's Police Foundations Diploma program with a minimum overall average of 75%, who are eligible, will be granted 6.0 credits toward the successful completion of a 20.0 credit Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Political Studies degree.
