This Addendum recognizes the changes outlined below, which took effect as of the Fall 2016 intake of the Social Service Worker Diploma program at Fleming College. This change will remain effective until the above-mentioned Agreement expires or until a new agreement is entered into, whichever occurs first.

The following changes occurred in Fleming College's Social Service Worker Diploma program:

• COMM 201 – Communications I (45 hours), which receives the Trent equivalent of WRIT 1001H, was added to the program

These changes refer specifically to Section 5 of the Agreement. The transfer credits received remain unchanged.

#### **BACHELOR OF SOCIAL WORK (HONOURS): TRANSFER CREDITS**

Students graduating from the Social Service Worker diploma program with a minimum overall average of 75%, who are eligible, will be granted 6.0 credits towards the successful completion of a 20.0 credit Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) degree.
