# **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

# Faculty of Forestry, University of British Columbia

and:

# Urban Forestry Program School of Environmental & Natural Resource Sciences Fleming College

### PURPOSE

This agreement formalizes the arrangements for graduates of the 2-year Urban Forestry Program (hereafter called the UF Program) offered by Fleming College, who meet the entrance requirements set by the University of British Columbia (UBC) and the Faculty of Forestry for the Bachelor of Urban Forestry Program (hereafter called the BUF Program), to continue their studies in the BUF Program.

### AGREEMENT

The transfer table included in Appendix 1 to this document recognizes exemptions from BUF courses that will be granted to UF graduates. The BUF program map for UF students included in Appendix 2 indicates the schedule UF graduates would follow to complete the BUF program.

UF graduates who have post-secondary course credits, in addition to those credits required to graduate from the UF program, may be granted additional exemptions or transfer credits in the BUF program. However, all students must successfully complete at least 60 credits in the BUF program, and otherwise meet all program requirements, in order to receive a BUF degree.

The BUF program agrees to honour the transfer arrangements that are in place at the time a UF graduate starts the BUF program, for as long as that individual remains a full-time student in the BUF program.

The term of this agreement is 5 years, dating from July 1 of the year in which this agreement is signed. The agreement may be extended beyond this with the support of both parties to this agreement.

### RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTIES

- 1. Admissibility of any UF graduate to the BUF program remains the sole discretion of UBC.
- 2. The parties agree to review the arrangements two years after the first UF graduate has begun studies in the BUF program.
- 3. Each party to this MOU agrees to inform the other party of any substantive changes to their curriculum that could affect the arrangements detailed in Appendices 1 and 2.
- 4. Each party agrees to collaborate on modifying the arrangements detailed in Appendices 1 and 2, as necessary, to accommodate changes to either curriculum.
- 5. Fleming College and the University of British Columbia will consult with each other prior to launching any marketing initiatives and fund raising initiatives (eg. materials, joint events, media releases) for this program. These shall include, but not be limited to, use of the logos and/or name of the respective organizations. Content and form shall be approved by both parties prior to publication or release.

## LICENSED MARK

The parties may only use a Licensed Mark of the other party in accordance with the following conditions and upon written approval from the other party:

- (a) all proposed uses, advertisements and displays of the Licensed Mark must be approved in writing by the other party in advance; the parties shall, at their own expense, provide the other party with mock-ups, prototypes or other samples that depict how they intends to use, advertise or display the Licensed Mark;
- (b) the size and placement of the Licensed Mark shall be satisfactory to the other party and shall not imply that the other is a partner, subsidiary, affiliate or agent of the other party, or is in any other relationship with the party other than the arrangement contemplated in this Agreement;
- (c) to the extent that either party is provided with trade-mark use style guides, that party shall use the Licensed Mark in compliance therewith;
- (d) the Licensed Mark of either party shall not be combined with any one or more trade-marks or trade names of the other or any other third party so as to form a unitary mark and shall not be incorporated into any one or more trade-marks or trade names of either party;
- (e) either party's use of the Licensed Mark shall not imply that either party endorses the other;
- (f) the parties shall comply with trade-mark marking requirements in force from time to time in Canada and shall at a minimum include markings that provide public notice of the fact that

the use of the Licensed Mark is a licensed use and of the identity of the other party as the owner; and

(g) the Licensed Mark shall only be used with respect to the arrangement contemplated in this Agreement and shall not be used in a context that reflects unfavourably upon either party, any products or services provided by either party or in a manner that diminishes or damages the goodwill in and to the Licensed Mark of either party.

## LIABILITY

Each party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other party in connection with any liabilities, claims, losses, costs, damages, charges and expenses whatsoever, including reasonable legal fees, in any way caused by or arising from the performance or non-performance of its obligations under this Agreement, any negligent act or omission, or any breach of any representation, warranty or covenant.

Neither party to this Agreement is liable to the other party for any negligent or wrongful act, either of commission or omission, of the other or of the student. Nothing in this Agreement is to be construed as either enlarging or diminishing any legal obligation or duty owed by one party to the other or to a third party.

# INFORMATION DISCLOSURE AND PRIVACY

All parties acknowledge that each party is subject to its own jurisdiction's laws regarding information disclosure and/or privacy and that access to information in respect of this Memorandum of Understanding will be provided in accordance with those laws. The records transferred to or collected, created, maintained or stored under this Memorandum of Understanding by each party are subject to the access provisions of the relevant jurisdiction's laws and shall not be released unless the applicable law so requires.
