

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN:

**THE GEORGIAN COLLEGE OF APPLIED ARTS AND TECHNOLOGY
(herein referred to as "GC")**

- and -

**FLEMING COLLEGE
(herein referred to as "FC")**

A. BACKGROUND

- A.1 **GEORGIAN COLLEGE** is a community college operating at various locations in the Province of Ontario.
- A.2 **FLEMING COLLEGE** is a community college operating at various locations in the Province of Ontario.
- A.3 Georgian College offers to its students the 2 year **Jewellery and Metals** diploma program.
- A.4 Fleming College offers to its students the 1 year **Jewellery Essentials** certificate program.

B. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this Agreement include, but are not limited to:

- B.1 Ensuring access by qualified graduates of the FC Program to the GC Program.

- B.2 Establishment of criteria to determine eligibility of FC graduates to the GC Program
- B.3 Establishment of processes to encourage, review and expand, as appropriate, the articulation agreement between GC and the FC.

C. AGREEMENT

- C.1 GC agrees to accept in the Jewellery and Metals Program FC graduates of the FC Program who meet the criteria set out in Schedule "A" of this Agreement.
- C.2 Each of GC and FC agrees to encourage FC students to participate in this articulation program by providing information and assistance to prospective transfer students.
- C.3 Each of GC and FC will designate a Program Representative at its respective campus to facilitate co-ordination of this agreement.

D. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- D.1 This Agreement will become effective on the 1st day of November, 2005, and shall have a term of five years, automatically renewable thereafter on a year to year basis unless at least twelve (12) months notice of termination in writing is provided by either party to the other.
- D.2 In the event of the termination of this Agreement under Section D.1, both parties acknowledge and agree that, subject to the qualification requirements set out in Schedule "A", all students enrolled in the FC Program as at the date of such termination shall be entitled to admission to the GC Program under this Agreement despite its termination upon their graduation from FC so as to ensure the fulfilment of the reasonable expectations of such students.
- D.3 Each institution must inform the other if substantive changes in curriculum (greater than 25%) are being determined.

E. GENERAL

E.1 Any notice or notices required to be given hereunder to either party shall effectively be given if delivered personally or sent by prepaid registered mail, mailed in the Province of Ontario, to the parties as follows:

Schedule A

Articulation Agreement between Georgian College and Fleming College

GC Program: Jewellery and Metals (Diploma)

FC Program: Jewellery Essentials (Certificate)

Fleming College graduates of the Jewellery Essentials program will be considered for entrance into Georgian College's Jewellery and Metals diploma program if seats are available. Successful applicants will enter directly into the second year of the GC Program. In addition, all applicants will be required to present a portfolio as part of the application process.

To be eligible for graduation, the following must be successfully completed, namely:

- 1 general education course
- College Communications (COMM1000)
- Communications at Work (COMM1001)
- 1 Jewellery and Metals work term
- All second year courses
