



Revised Articulation Agreement

Fleming College and Trent University

General Arts and Science - University Transfer Option

Introduction

This agreement establishes the principles, guidelines, and procedures governing admission and assessment of selected qualified students to enter a *Bachelor of Arts* or *Bachelor of Science* (Psychology major) *program a Trent University* on an advanced standing basis, subsequent to the successful completion of the *General Arts and Science – University Transfer Option at Fleming College*. Hereafter, this collaborative effort will be referred to as the "articulation agreement." This is a pilot project which will be assessed after an initial 3 year period.

Purpose

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to permit qualified students from the 1 year University Transfer Option program at Fleming College to enter a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science program at Trent University.

Objectives

- To outline the process for admission to Trent University for qualified graduates of the specified program at Fleming College and general conventions regarding advanced standing credit to be applied towards the degree at Trent University
- 2) To provide for periodic review and assessment of the articulation agreement with respect to academic integrity and all other aspects of the articulation agreement.

Conditions and Terms of the Agreement

- 1) Fleming College and Trent University agree to set up a joint committee to oversee the administration of the articulation agreement.
- 2) Joint committee responsibilities include, but are not limited to: application procedures, an annual review of courses, credit transfer, enrolment data, student performance, administrative matters, and all other pertinent issues, as necessary. This activity will take place on an annual basis, to be established at a mutually convenient time for both parties. The Committee must ensure that the University Transfer Option courses maintain the quality of curriculum, expectations and instruction expected of Trent first year courses. The pilot project will be reviewed after three years to assess overall performance.
- 3) Transfer credit will proceed in accordance with the following:

- i) Upon successful completion of the General Arts and Science University Transfer Option program at Fleming College, students with a minimum 70% average overall and a minimum of 65% in each of the transfer credit subjects will be eligible to make application to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science program at Trent University on an advanced standing basis.
- ii) Trent University will grant direct entry and assign 4 credits, as outlined in the agreement, towards the successful completion of a degree program.
- iii) Upon admission to a Trent University Program, students are required to follow the university's and program's regulations and requirements.
- iv) Appendix A (attached) outlines the requirements to be met.

Review of Agreement

This pilot program will be reviewed annually and fully assessed after 3 years. This Agreement may be terminated by either party. In this case, notice of one year is required. In the event of termination of the Agreement, every effort will be made to ensure that students currently enrolled in the program will not be affected.

Degree Completion options for Graduates of Fleming College's General Arts and Science – University Transfer Option

The purpose of this agreement is to permit qualified students from the University Transfer Option program at Fleming College to enter a degree program at Trent University at the second year level. These students will be given 4 credits towards the degree and must complete the additional credits required in the Trent program selected.

To qualify for entry into second year at Trent, Fleming College University Transfer Option graduates must have

- an average of 70% overall, and
- a minimum of 65% in each of the four transfer credit courses (English, Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology).

Each transfer credit course grade will be calculated by averaging across both terms.

Entering Trent, qualified students will be granted:

- ENGL 100 credit
- PHIL 101 credit
- PSYC 101 credit
- SOCI 100 credit

Note: Numerical grades will not be recorded on the Trent transcript. Completion of these credits will be recognized with a "Pass" grade.

To complete the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree, students will have to complete both the Trent University and specific department/program requirements as outlined in the Trent University calendar.
