Appropriate Use Policy

2-201A Academic Integrity

Each student has the responsibility to support academic integrity.

Breaches of academic integrity (such as cheating or plagiarism) will be dealt with accordingly and shall be reported by the Professor, in writing, to the Registrar.

- I. Fleming College is committed to educating all members of the college community with regard to academic integrity policies and procedures.
- 2. It is expected that all members of the college community will maintain an environment of academic integrity in all aspects of academic life including learning, teaching, research and administration.
- 3. It is the responsibility of students, staff and faculty to be aware of and to comply with standards outlined by this academic integrity policy and related procedures.
- 4. All members of the college have a responsibility to detect and report breaches of academic integrity and address them according to the established procedures.
- 5. Sanctions for breaches of academic integrity will be related to the nature of the offence as outlined in the related administrative operating procedure.

What is a violation?

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Is it a Breach?



You leave class after completing a test. A group of classmates from another section of the course approach you and demand the answers to the test you have just completed, as they will be taking the test on another day.

You quickly jot down the questions you can remember and give them to the group.



You are a second semester student and your friend is in first semester. You let your friend copy your lab data from the assignment that you did when you were in first semester.



Your teacher starts a test by telling everyone "keep your eyes on your own paper, no talking".

The person sitting beside you turns and asks to borrow a pencil or eraser.



You and your roommates are up late studying for a test. The material is really complex so as a group you decide to each take a section of information to study. As a group you come up with a series of signals to use during the test so that you can communicate answers to one another.



You don't feel your writing skills are quite as good as some of your classmates. To try and avoid getting in trouble for plagiarism you use an online generator that allows you to enter text from articles and it creates paraphrased sentences for you. You then use these in the body of your essay.



You are working in a group. You have completed your part of the assignment and have submitted to the team member responsible for compiling each members work. Your group members are submitting their parts, but no one is checking the final result for accuracy or plagiarism. One of the group members forgot to cite some information in their part of the assignment.



You are working on a computer on campus and a classmate asks to use your computer for a second. You don't bother logging out and let them use it quickly. Without you knowing they find an assignment that you've completed for class and use your email to send the assignment to themselves to submit it as their own work.



You have an assignment to hand in, but you have a part-time job and have not been able to get it done and are having trouble with some of the formulas. Lots of others are in the same situation so they decide to copy the work of another student.

You decide to visit tutoring for help. You make an appointment at tutoring and the tutor helps to explain the questions and you complete the assignment. You end up handing in the assignment a day late.



You are really pressed to get all of your assignments in on time. On Facebook you see an ad for original essays that can be purchased online. You find the website and purchase an essay complete with citations and submit it as your own assignment to your teacher.



You missed a test and handing in an assignment when you took a couple of days off school to hang out with friends. In order to not be penalized for grades, you told your Professor you were ill. Your Professor has requested a doctor's note. You create one yourself and hand in to your teacher.



You have done all your research for your paper and taken a ton of notes. When writing your paper you realize you have lost the citation information for one of the key points you want to include in your paper. As it is the only point from that resource you decide to create a citation for it



You have a friend review your assignment and they make a number of changes for you. You submit the changed assignment.



Your teacher has given a library research assignment that requires all students find specific books in the library and passages within those books. You want to have the best grade in class so quietly move an item in the library so it is shelved in the wrong place so others can't find it.
