7.	SPC not accepted at Pizza Pizza and Epic Burger	Response from Pizza Pizza: "Participation with this card and program is not a mandatory policy for the franchises that participate. As a whole they support it but they do leave it up to the individual franchise in regards to if they actually participate or not.  • As we are a non-traditional location we don't participate in these programs simply because our financial cost structures are different than the regular retail stores, making it cost prohibitive to accommodate it (due to higher labour rates and higher operating costs). We also run different items that don't always line up with what these cards offer I.e. Extreme Pita's deal is for a pita and can of pop — as we don't carry cans of pop the deal is irrelevant. Pizza Pizza's deal is for a 2.99 slice of pizza and pop — again this is not effective for us as street level retail stores standard size is the 16" pizza as a non-traditional store our standard size is an 18" pizza — so it's not cost compatible with what they are offering.  We do participate in other programs that do make financial/cost sense and bring benefits to the students when they are available, such as the Buy 3 get the 4th Free pizza deal which is currently running (with roughly 280 free slices being provided at this point) and the Pizza Pizza Cineplex deal which usually happens in March. These programs help bring the value to the students in other ways then the Student Price Card programs."
