1. Welcome

Sandra and Silvana welcomed new and current faculty back and acknowledged their important role and great work with students at the college.

New full-time faculty (Matt Ryan, Liz Stone, Sara Mormul) and new contract faculty (Marcia Siekowiski and Christian Connolly) were welcomed into their roles.

Silvana announced with excitement that the CICE program has 24 first semester students and 22 returning students in the fall. This is the highest intake on record for the CICE program. This program's orientation will be held on Wednesday, August 30th, 2017. She also welcomed Laura Hewitt as the new FT Integration Facilitator, Keller Meekin and Broke Benson, the two new part-time Integration Facilitators; She informed that the CICE program will have a new part-time Operations Manager, who will be announced by the end of the day and will start on September 5th in his/her role.

2. Celebrations/Awards

Silvana congratulated Joan Connolly (15 years), George Fogarasi (10 years) and Peter Laurie (15 years) for their service to Fleming College.

Silvana also congratulated Tom Jenkins and Joan Connolly for completing their probationary period.

It was also announced that Sandra Dupret received the Leadership Award at Haliburton Campus on June 20th. Silvana spoke about Sandra's qualities as a leader and Dean of both GAS and Haliburton schools.

Indigenous Perspectives

Liz Stone joined the LDS team this summer and, together with the Law & Justice faculty identified places where indigenous content and curriculum could be incorporated. A

mapping document was created by the LDS team, which helps identify internal and external resources for faculty by using an existing framework.

General Electives Policy and Procedure

A consultant has been hired to evaluate mandated general electives. Changes to policy will be made based on feedback brought to the General Education Committee.

Sandra recognized the work done by Molly Westland in the Quality Audit in the Spring, and Silvana with the General Elective Policy.

Silvana explained that the General Electives Policy is housed in the School of General Arts and Sciences. The policy will ensure that every program satisfies the Ministry's requirement of three (3) general education courses in each diploma program of study.

A General Elective Committee will be re-established with the involvement of the school and will focus on feedback received and on students' interests. The audit will take place in March.
