You are probably well aware of the College Strategic Planning that recently finished with the release of the new 5year plan. You are probably also aware of the current work by the VPAE to develop a new Academic Plan, which should be in place by the end of the fall semester. Next up will be the creation of a SENRS Strategic Plan. To move that forward, the Dean and Chairs will be creating a draft strategic plan based on the College Strategic Plan and the Academic Plan as it comes together. This document will simply be a draft about which we will have focused discussions across the School in the winter semester. The final plan will be based on the results from those discussions. - disclosing personal information about a student to other students, parents, staff, etc. without a signed Freedom of Information Form from the student; and
- storing hard copies of personal information in easily accessed/shared spaces.
