## Academic Upgrading

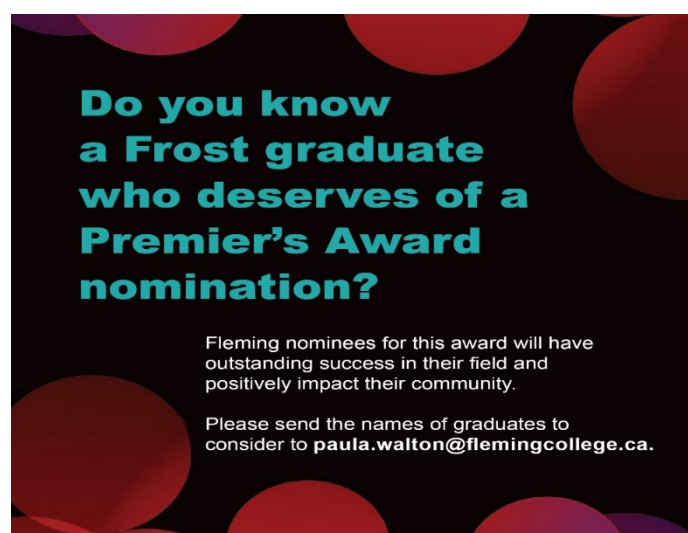
**If you have a student who is struggling, and in need of remedial help, we can help!!**

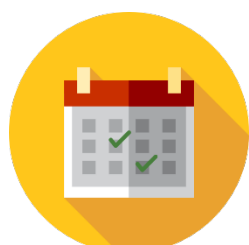
Post-secondary students who will benefit:
